1. First Berlin Science Slam in Cairo

On the occasion of the "German Weeks" held in Cairo from 17 April to 5 May 2012, the Liaison Office of Freie Universität Berlin in cooperation with Technische Universität Berlin organized the "First Berlin Science Slam in Cairo" on 24 April. Science slams offer young researchers an excellent chance to introduce their work to the general public outside of classrooms and laboratories. Four doctoral candidates from different Graduate Schools in Berlin presented their research in an entertaining and understandable way. Each presenter had ten minutes to explain his research. More than 130 participants attended the First Berlin Science Slam in Cairo. The audience was the jury that judged the presentations on content, clarity and entertainment. 3. New Faces Conference: "Socio-Economic Malaise as a Security Threat - Which Model and Reforms for Egypt?" in Cairo

From 28 June to 1 July 2012, the EU-Middle East Forum (EUMEF) of the German Council of Foreign Relations (DGAP), Robert-Bosch-Stiftung und The American University in Cairo (AUC) organize the 16th New Faces Conference in Cairo in cooperation with the Liaison Office of Freie Universität Berlin. Young academics and professionals discuss Egypt's socioeconomic challenges after the presidential elections under the title "Socio-Economic Malaise as a Security Threat - Which Model and Reforms for Egypt?". The event is one of three New Faces Conferences this year, all taking place in Cairo. Within the same framework DGAP organizes a summer school in late august and early September in Berlin on the topic "Status Quo and the Road Ahead for Transition in Egypt and Tunesia".

4. Project "Gender Equality in the Egyptian Higher Education System"

In April, a DAAD funded project between Freie Universität and four Egyptian partner universities has started. It aims at developing and implementing equal-opportunity measures in the Egyptian higher education system and exchanging German and Egyptian experiences in the field of gender equality. At the same time, it will add an international perspective to gender and diversity discourses at Freie Universität. As a first project activity, representatives of the University of Alexandria, Cairo, Sohag and South Valley (Qena) as well as the Egyptian Ministry of Higher Education will travel to Berlin in June in order to obtain information on equal-opportunity policies at Freie Universität and discuss their applicability to Egyptian circumstances. 5. "The Situation in Syria" — Simulation Conference with Egyptian and Libyan diplomats

The Department of Law at Freie Universität Berlin and the German Foreign Office held a simulated session of the UN Security Council on April 26, 2012.

The exercise focused on the mechanisms of the so-called international responsibility to protect. The participants in the simulation represented the current members of the Security Council. The event brought together 22 young diplomats from Egypt and Libya who participated in a training course within the framework of the German Federal Foreign Office's transformation partnership for the countries involved in the Arab Spring. 6. Angelika Neuwirth received Honorary Doctorate from Yale University

Angelika Neuwirth, Professor of Arabic Studies at Freie Universität Berlin received the Honorary Doctor from Yale University in the discipline of religious studies. Yale University honored Neuwirth for her contributions to Islamic and Arabic Studies and as one of the worldwide leading experts in research on the Koran. Neuwirth is director of the research project "Corpus Coranicum" of the Berlin Brandenburg Academy of Sciences. Her work focuses on classical and modern Arabic literature and the Koran. 7. Peter Pökel teaches at Al-Azhar University

From December 2011 to May 2012, Dr. Peter Pökel, teaching assistant at the Institute of Arabic Studies at Freie Universität Berlin, taught the seminar "Islamic Studies in the West. Origins, history and methods" held in Arabic language at Al-Azhar University. The short-term lectureship had been established in the framework of cooperation between Orient Institute Beirut, Eberhard Karls Universität Tübingen and Al-Azhar University Cairo and is sponsored by the DAAD.

8. Emad Flear Aziz at Biovision in Alexandria

On invitation of the DAAD, Cairo born Prof. Dr. Emad Flear Aziz participated in this year's Biovision Conference that took place from 22 to 25 April in Alexandria. Emad Flear Aziz is professor of physics at Freie Universität Berlin and recently gained the prestigious Starting Grant of the European Research Council. In Alexandria he presented his breathtaking career "From DAAD scholarship to a professorship in Germany" to students and young Egyptian scientists in a DAAD panel on the internationalization of higher education. Furthermore Aziz could establish important contacts with colleagues in his home country. The Biovision Meeting takes place once in two years in Alexandria and is organized by Bibliotheca Alexandrina in cooperation with the World Life Sciences Forum.

9. Call for Applications, Berlin Graduate School of Ancient Studies

The newly founded Berlin Graduate School of Ancient Studies is pleased to receive applications for its new PhD program "History of Ancient Science". Berlin is unique in the world for its concentration of expertise and resources in the field of the History of Science in the ancient world. The universities are in close co-operation with the Max-Planck-Institut für Wissenschaftsgeschichte and the Berlin-Brandenburgische Wissenschaften.
