






Application and Admission Processes for Master's Programs



Application process in 6 steps





Step 1: Check the admission requirements

Each master program has its own regulations regarding admission as well as how many students are admitted (Zugangssatzung), hence each master has specific admission requirements.

Admission requirements

Consecutive Master

- undergraduate degree in the same or a similiar field of study
- sometimes specialization, credit points in specific modules
- German language skills if required
- English language skills if required
- In some cases further language skills

Master of education

- university degree with specific amount of credits in didactics and pedagogy from a German university
- German language skills
- often further language skills

Continuing Education Master

- university degree
- vocational experiences of at least 12 months in the field of study
- often German language skills
- often further language skills
- programs charge tuition fees



Admission Requirements: Example

Consecutive Master

- undergraduate degree in the same or a similiar field of study
- sometimes specialization, credit points in specific modules
- German language skills if required
- English language skills if required
- In some cases further language skills

Example: Master Finance, Accounting and Taxation (German-language program)

Admission Requirements

For admittance to the master's program applicants need to fulfill the following admission requirements:

- Bachelor's degree in economics or law with a minimum of 45 credit points in the foundations of business taxation, business and public finance, and managerial and finance accounting and in legal areas related to economics; as well as a minimum of 5 credit points in microeconomics and a minimum of 18 credit points in the foundations of mathematics (a minimum of 6 credit points), foundations of statistics (a minimum of 6 credit points), and economic computer science; or an equivalent degree.
- Proof of English language skills (level B2 CEFR or equivalent).
- Ability to conduct supervised work on subjects in the area of economic theory or legal subjects using scholarly methods as exhibited by the presentation of a final paper in German or English, usually a bachelor's thesis or a comparable work (at least 15 pages).

The DSH - or German Language University Entrance Exam for Foreign Students - is obligatory for all applicants whose first language is not German and who have earned their initial degree from a university (or equivalent institution) where the language of instruction is not German.

Admission Requirements: Example

Example: Master Global History (English-language program)

Admission Requirements

For admittance to the master's program applicants need to fulfill the following admission requirements:

- An above average degree on par with a Bachelor in History, Regional Studies, or a related field that includes equivalent historical or regional topics (minimum of 60 credits), which can be proven with a transcript of records. In all cases, at least 60 credits must be accredited from historical or regional courses.
- The MA Global History is an English-language program. Therefore, all applicants to the program must prove that they have English skills at a C1 (CEFR) level or higher. For more information, please visit the homepage of the master's program.

German Language Skills

For the application, you need one of these certificates

- C1 CEFR certificate with grades
- TestDaF with at least level 4 in two parts and level 3 in two parts (f.e. 4/4/3/3)
- language evaluation test, which attests skills at level C1 CEFR
- DSH 1

For enrollment, you need one of these certificates

- DSH 2 (test offered by FU Berlin)
- Telc C 1-Hochschule
- C 2-Zertifikat des Goethe-Instituts
- Deutsches Sprachdiplom der Kultusministerkonferenz - Zweite Stufe (DSD II)
- Feststellungsprüfung des Studienkollegs (Assessment Exam of the Studienkolleg)
- <u>TestDaF</u> with at least level 4 in all four parts




English Skills

Step 2: Fill out the application form and upload the documents

- Application deadline
- Application form
- Required documents



Application Deadline

- The application deadline depends on the type of master program and/or whether the master program has an admission restriction or limited enrollment (Numerus Clausus)
- The Latin term Numerus Clausus stands for "restricted number" and means that the number of applicants admitted must not be (much) higher than the number of available places (as calculated by the respective university).



Does my study program have restricted admission?

To see whether a study program has restricted admission, look for information regarding the phrase "restricted admission" or "unrestricted admission" in the program description at https://www.fu-berlin.de/en/studium/studienangebot/master/index.html



Application Deadlines

(Consecutive) Master's programs (without Master of Education) with at least one admission restriction in the first semester or higher semester:

for the summer semester: 01.12. - 15.01.

for the winter semester: 24.04. - 31.05.

(Consecutive) Master's programs offered without restriction in all subject semesters, and all Master of Education degrees:

for the summer semester: 01.12. - 15.02.

for the winter semester: 24.04. - 15.08.

Continuing Education Master's programs:

Deadline according to the <u>program description</u>



Number of Applications

(Consecutive) master's programs, 1st semester applications

→ maximum of 2

(Consecutive) master's programs, higher semester → 1 application

Continuing education master's programs → as many as you wish

- Register for an application account in the FU portal
- After registering, you will receive a link to the application portal via e-mail
- Using this link, complete the online application, upload all the required documents, and submit the application digitally



Online Application through uni-assist

Bachelor's degree obtained outside of Germany

- Register for the application portal MyAssist at www.uni-assist.de/en
- Complete the online application and submit it digitally
- Upload all required documents
- Pay the application fee*

*EUR 75.00 for your first application, EUR 30.00 for every further application





Required Documents to submit

In general, you need to submit the following documents:

- graduation certificate (i.e. BA degree, if you have completed your bachelor's studies)
- official current transcript of records with an overall grade
- official translations of all certificates if issued in any language other than German or English
- proof of language skills
 - proof of English skills if required
 - Proof of German skills if required
 - proof of other language skills if required
- if applicable, additional study-related skills and documents





Step 4: Wait for the Selection Process

Selection quotas in master's programs with restricted admission:

5 % hardships

Remaining study places:

20 % wait time

80 % university quota*

*calculation depends on the admission statues of each master's program; usually the grade-point-average (GPA) of your bachelor's degree plus additional points for vocational experience, subject-related specialisations, and/or an interview.






Step 5: Take the DSH test if necessary

- You only need to take the DSH exam for those master's programs that are taught in German
- If you have an equivalent (see step 1), you do not need to take the DSH test

Step 6: Enroll

- You will receive a notification of enrollment (or a rejection notice if you have not been accepted) in the application portal.
- The enrollment deadline will be specified there. You can only accept the
 offered study place and complete the online data entry within the
 enrollment period. If you do not complete the online data entry by the
 deadline, the admissions offer will expire and the study place will be given
 to another applicant.

Costs and finances

- Monthly costs depend on a variety of factors, including living situation, family status, lifestyle, etc.
- No general tuition; only semester fees, which includes costs for the public transportation ticket (Deutschlandsemesterticket)
 approximately 300,00 EUR
- Federal Student Assistance Act (BAfög)
 - a state-funded and need-based loan
 - available for international students if they fulfill certain criteria
 - Maximum funding: about 900 €/month
