Regaining Lost Knowledge – Connecting Research at Home and in Exile

Academics in Solidarity (AiS) is a peer-mentoring program that connects exiled researchers and established scholars in Germany, Lebanon and Jordan. It seeks to create a network of solidarity, strengthen the value of cross-cultural research cooperation and open up new perspectives within the academic environment of the host country. The program offers support to displaced and endangered scholars through mentoring, academic counseling, systematic network building, and funding of small research endeavors. It further benefits mentors by offering them special training as well as administrative and technical support both prior to and throughout the mentoring process. The project is funded by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF).

The network conference will signify the launch of a new stage of *Academics in Solidarity*. As of today, more than 80 displaced and endangered scholars have registered as mentees with AiS. The conference will give them the opportunity to present their research to a wider community, bring them together with established scholars and mentors and expand their professional and academic networks. The conference will further serve as a platform for exchange among key stakeholders representing support programs for at-risk scholars, research funding organizations, expert communities and AiS partner institutions in Germany, Lebanon and Jordan.
