The Visual Arts in Cold War Germany and Beyond

Saturday, October 9, 2:00 – 4:00 p.m., OCC 207

For the twentieth anniversary of reunification, this panel investigates German art in the Cold War period. It begins by comparing art and exhibition strategies on both sides of the Wall in the 1950s and 1960s before turning to a group of West German artists who left the country in 1961 to join an international art movement. It ends with an investigation the rise of the West German art movement "Neo Expressionism" to international prominence in the 1980s and its reception since the Wende; significantly, several of these artists began in East Germany. The panel as a whole reveals the importance of national identity and competition to the development of German art after 1945.
