#### **Future Erasmus participation update**

Following lengthy Brexit discussions, it has been confirmed that the UK will not participate in the next generation Erasmus programme. This does not affect our participation in the current Erasmus programme and we are working with our partners to continue to exchange students and staff until the end of our current projects.

We appreciate that this news creates uncertainty around how we might work together in the future. We would like to reiterate Goldsmiths commitment to international partnerships and to the exchange of students and staff. The UK Government have confirmed that they will create a new UK programme, called the Turing Scheme to enable students to still gain experience abroad. We are awaiting final details but will share more information with partners once we have more it and discuss future collaboration further.

## **Application Procedure**

Once nominated, Goldsmiths will email the students directly with a link to the application form. The application deadlines are as follows:

- For the Autumn term and full year, the deadline is 30 July 2020
- For the Spring/Summer term, the deadline is 1 November 2020.

## **Academic Information**

### **Term dates 2021/22**

#### Autumn term

Welcome Week: 24 September – 1 October 2021

Term: 27 September – 10 December 2021

#### Spring/Summer term

Welcome Week: 10 January – 16 January 2022 (tbc)

Term: 17 January - 24 June 2022

Teaching finishes at the end of the spring term on 1 April 2022. There is then a break for Easter, and the summer term begins on 3 May 2022 and runs until 24 June 2022. If students take modules that are assessed by exams, then they are required to be on campus in the summer term to sit these. If students choose modules that are assessed by essays/coursework, then this can usually be submitted online remotely so students can leave campus at the end of teaching in March.

Welcome Week: 24 September – 1 October 2021 Term: 27 September 2021 – 24 June 2022

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#### **Modules**

Students can only select modules from within their host department, and at their level of study.

Module selection takes place via an online form, which is sent to autumn and full year students in July and to spring/summer students in November. Students are required to complete this form to select their modules. It is the student's responsibility to complete their Learning Agreement.

Undergraduate students generally study 4 modules per term. This equates to 60 Goldsmiths credits (30 ECTS).

#### **Grading system**

All courses and programmes at Goldsmiths are validated on the basis of one Goldsmiths' credit being equivalent to 0.5 ECTS. This will be the case at both undergraduate and postgraduate level in line with the recommendations in the *2009 ECTS User Guide* published by the European Commission: http://ec.europa.eu/education/lifelong-learning-policy/doc/ects/guide\_en.pdf

A 15 credit Goldsmiths module will therefore be worth 7.5 ECTS.

#### **European Credit Transfer Scheme (ECTS)**

All courses and programmes at Goldsmiths are validated on the basis of one Goldsmiths' credit being equivalent to 0.5 ECTS. A 30 credit Goldsmiths' course will therefore be worth 15 ECTS.

## Language requirements

Our English Language requirement is higher grades at CEFR Level B2, or IELTS 6.0 for Undergraduates with 6.0 in writing and no element lower than 5.5 and IELTS 6.5 for Postgraduates with 6.5 in writing and no element lower than 6.0.

#### **Immigration support**

Students joining Goldsmiths for the autumn term or the spring/summer term are likely to need a <u>Standard Visitor Visa</u> to study in the UK. <u>Visa nationals</u> must apply for this before coming to the UK.
