Abstract

The world is on a growth trajectory that runs the severe risk to miss even the modest 2-degree target of the Paris Accord and to jeopardize the achievement of the sustainable development goals. From a global perspective, climate policies have not been successful. This verdict holds for national strategies as well as for the approach of sustainable finance that wants to incorporate environmental, social, and governance (ESG) principles into business decisions, economic growth processes, and investment strategies. At the same time, the awareness of climate-related financial risks is growing, not least due to increasing risks stemming from damage to property, land, and infrastructure as well as from weather-related damages. Moreover, changes in relative prices of energy sources as well as political decisions may result in stranded assets and broader economic disruption. Sustainable finance also covers efforts to redirect capital flows to countries that are in urgent need to adjust to rising temperatures.

As society's expectations change, the finance industry must be transparent and clear about how its products and services simultaneously create value for its customers, clients, investors, as well as for society.

As a result of all those economic and political processes, finance industry and financial markets have moved center in promoting sustainable development. This includes the practices of financial institutions like pensions funds, the role of central banks in designing frameworks for green finance, and also the efforts of financial actors to create new financial products and services in support of sustainability transitions.
