Funded by the joint seed money initiative of FU & HUJI




## Teaching formats

- 7) Joint workshop in Jerusalem





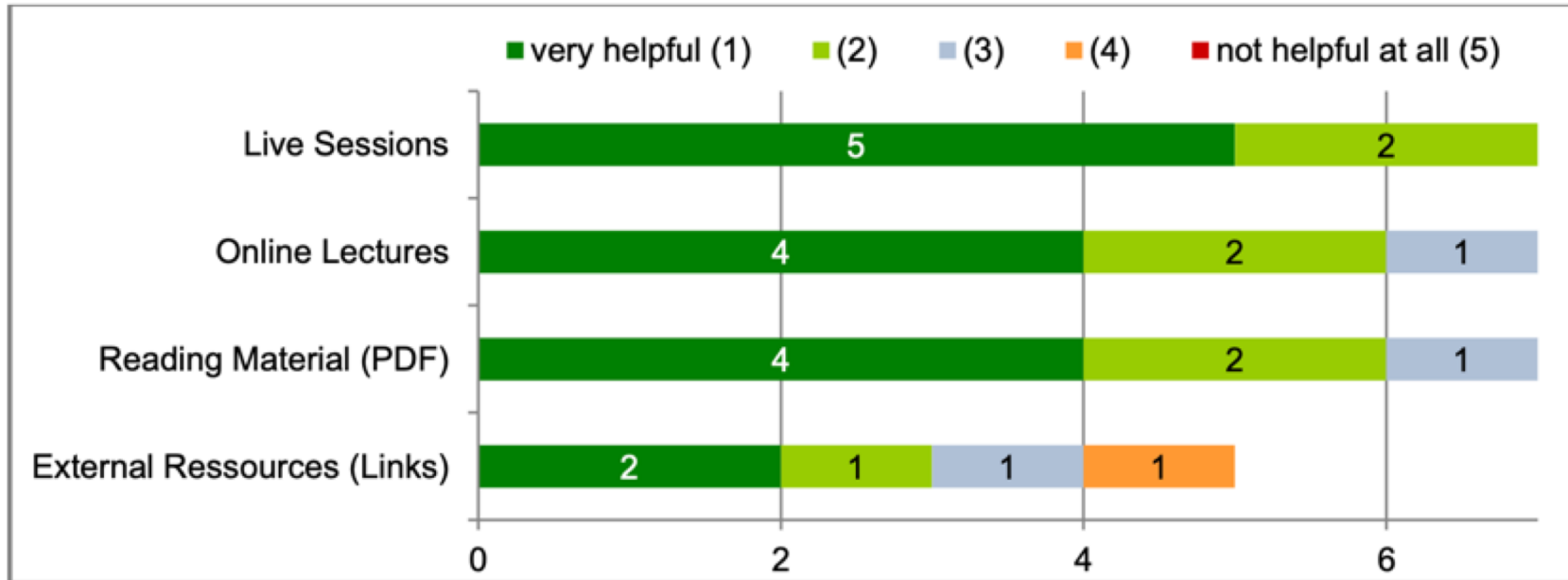

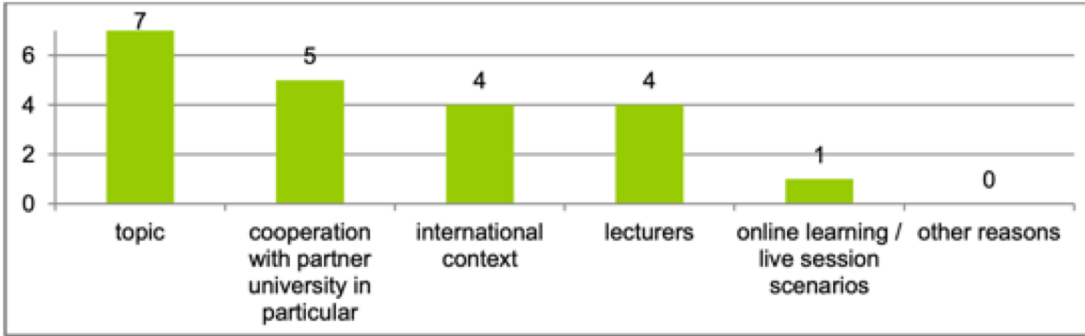

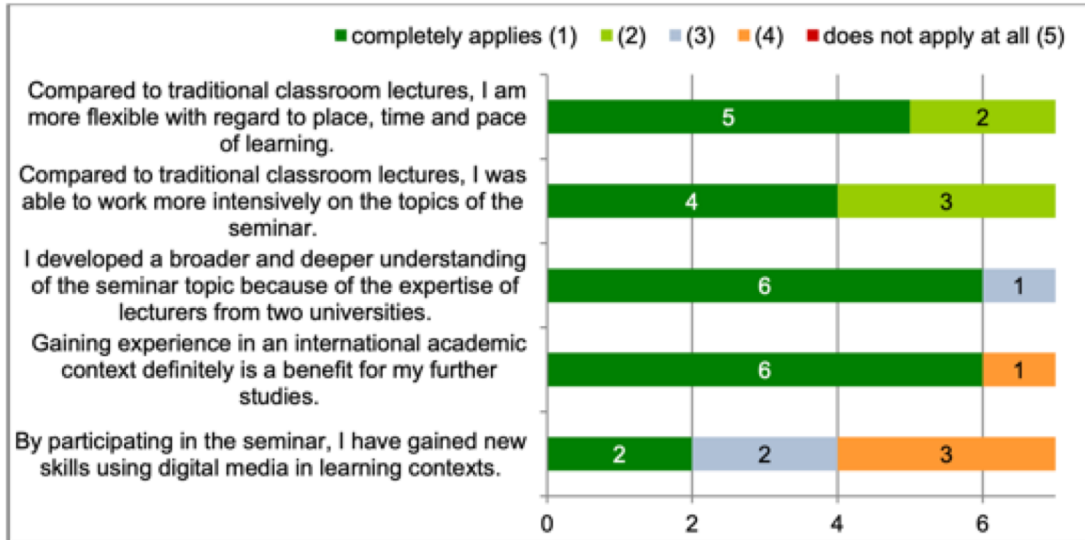
