- Students present conclusions
- Lecturer responds, corrects,
 fills gaps

WHEN? conceptual questions, counter-intuitive ideas, predict the result of a demonstration


Shared Documents (google docs, google slides, Padlet)

Write individual response

Discussion in Rooms (optional)

Whole class & lecturer's input

- Personal space within a shared space
- Invites responses from everyone
- Keeps students accountable



Tips for effective application:

- ✓ Allow a few minutes for individual response
- ✓ Try group work in breakout rooms at least once
- ✓ Make sure to respond directly to students' ideas, answers and comments

Two-stage activates during **A-synchronous** learning

At home

Read or watch

Write a response & respond to others

- Forum activity (Moodle)
- Shared documents
- Fill a questionnaire
- Write comments on designated platforms

In Class

Discussion & lecturer's input

Two-stage activates during A-synchronous learning

Tips for effective application:

- ✓ Make at-home activities required for all (participation grade/ required submission)
- ✓ Make sure to frame the discussion based on individual responses.

Benefits:

- ✓ Students can adapt learning at home to their personal prefferations
- ✓ Class time is more focused on high-quality, prepared-for interaction
