"Artificial Intelligence & the Future of Democracy"



The 33rd edition of the Estoril Political Forum – organised by the Institute for Political Studies of the Catholic University of Portugal, Lisbon — investigates the impact of artificial intelligence on the democratic process. The meeting brings together leading policymakers and academics from the US, UK, Portugal and the rest of Europe.

As usual, the Europaeum will host the 'Europaeum Special Debate'. This is a public event in the style of an Oxford Union debate. It is led by three Europaeum graduate students, alongside students from the Catholic University of Portugal and Jagiellonian University, each speaking for or against the given proposition, with expert commentators at hand. The event concludes with an open vote on the proposition. The motion to be debated will be: "Democracy must adapt to a world with AI".

Successful applicants will have their accommodation, travel and board (including dinners) covered for this three-day conference. They are expected to book their own travel and will be reimbursed during the conference.
