Application Procedure

The program starts every winter semester. This year's applications must be handed in before July 10, 2014. All students will be admitted and first enrolled to the Master program at SPbU, then enrolled at FU. The entire application must be completed online. To apply for the program, you need to use the special online service called "Personal Account".

After registering at the service you will be able to upload your document sets to your Personal Account. (for more information:

All candidates have to pass entrance examinations that take place in the form of interviews (either face-to-face or via telepresence) in July 2014. Face-to-face interviews take place at SPbU.

Tuition Fees and Scholarships

Both universities offer up to 10 funded places for German and international students. While studying at SPbU German students can apply for an additional DAAD scholarship. While studying at FU Russian and international students can apply for a grant.

Freie Universität Berlin does not charge tuition fees for consecutive Master programs. Instead, the university charges all students with "semester fees and contributions" of approx. EUR 300, including public transportation costs in Berlin.

Students enrolled on the fee-paying basis pay tuition fees as set by SPbU, which is fixed at the sum of 90.000 roubles per semester.

Admissions

The Master program Global Communication and International Journalism attracts graduates with a BA level or higher academic degree or a Specialist university degree in social sciences as well as humanities.

Application requirements:

- An original or a certified copy of a bachelor diploma or of a diploma of a specialist with higher professional education or a specialist's diploma.
- A short letter of motivation containing
 1) explanation of the applicant motives and expectations of the program;
 - 2) details about the key aspects chosen in his/her previous study program(s);
 - 3) relevant work experience in the fields of journalism, public relations and/ or public communication.
- Professional-academic portfolio
- Proof of English language skills
- A copy of an identity document
- A portrait photograph
